Brainstorming Questions

Answer the following questions:

- 1. What is it going to take to achieve permanency for youth?
 - Chloe is in a residential setting and will need to successfully complete the program prior to transitioning to a family setting.
 - Chloe has shared concerns about legal permanency and would benefit from ongoing, supportive conversations that honor her perspective and help explore what permanency could look like for her. Continued dialogue can help us understand and respond to her feelings about adoption.
 - Exploring potential kinship connections when identifying the next steps for Chloe.
 - Ensuring supports who are identified by Chloe fully understand her ongoing mental health and behavioral needs and commit to continue to make sure those needs would be met.
- 2. What can we try that we've NEVER tried before?
 - Work with kinship specialist to create a genogram (family tree) for Chloe. Present genogram to Chloe to review.
 - Reach out to the Board of Developmental Disabilities who is linked with Chloe to gain a comprehensive understanding of her specific supervision, behavioral, educational, and mental health needs.
 - Reach out to previous placement ABC Group Home to inquire about potential opportunities for support from people Chloe will identify as important to her.
- 3. What can we try that HAS been tried?
 - Circle back to previous kinship caregivers for Chloe to inquire about willingness to be a support. Discuss options of support to not only include placement.
 - Discuss with Chloe's treatment team any recommendations regarding placement with siblings following the successful completion of her treatment program.
- 4. What can we do concurrently?
 - Adoption is primary focus. Team would consider legal custody if kinship identified or a foster placement expressed a willingness to consider lesser restrictive permanency outcome.
